



MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Building community and celebrating the importance of strong relationships, includes teaching students to prioritize their loved ones and the well-being of those around them. We have a strong focus on social-emotional learning at Evergreen, from regular sharing circles, conflict resolution skills, embedded SEL curriculum, and support from SLPs working directly with students and classes.

Beyond the classroom, we recognize that maintaining and sharing our facilities is key to providing playful places for our local community. Families, groups, teams and more come to use the pavilion, forest, field, and playgrounds regularly, as well as the Castle Care after school care program.

Something new this year has been reaching out beyond our campus, and making connections with the Sacred Cedar Centre, situated on Cowichan Tribes land in Duncan. Evergreen in situated right in the heart of Cobble Hill, on unceded lands that have been lived upon for time immemorial by both the Hul'qumi'num & SENĆOŦEN speaking people, including Quw'utsun and MÁLEXEŁ people. This new outreach aims to build warm relationships that will allow our students to learn from those that know this land best.

Recently, all students in kindergarten to grade 7 spent the day at Sacred Cedar Centre. They sang, drummed, created cedar roses, learned about the garden and native species, and played Hul'qumi'num bingo to learn indigenous names for local fauna. It was such a beautiful day, with gentle learning. We have our next trip booked for May.

We are so grateful for this growing connection with Hwiemtun and his colleagues. Their skill, knowledge, kindness, warmth, and relationships with our students are incredibly valued.



Outdoor activity occurs every day, in the form of physical education, gardening, local hiking field trips, and community involvement projects like community clean ups or learning days with educators from Cowichan Tribes.

Having so much time outdoors stimulates a sense of wonder for the natural world, as well as fostering creativity and hands on learning experiences which often engage all their senses.

A uniquely tight-knit community, Evergreen is run on the efforts of its families, who contribute volunteer hours at board meetings, cleaning bees, fundraisers, and seasonal fairs throughout the year.
