


# Spring has Sprung

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
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

# The Planground Project



Evergreen School is a unique and special place, where we strive to serve each student to the best of our abilities. This is what Inclusivity is about.

One key area for continued growth is in our physical accessibility; in our very old school house, there is no easy way to create accessibility for people with mobility differences Likewise, our playgrounds are suited to those students with typical development.

We have come up with a plan. It is a very ambitious plan, and we need the support of our community.

The Playful Places Ramp Project seeks to make the main school building accessible in a playful way that also meets the developmental needs of our students, including those with sensory, and physical differences.

The design we're sharing is an early concept drawing; we're working on revisions and elaborations while we work with the architects, engineers and builders who will ensure our project is safe for student and community use.
